


Introduction of new activities!

HEA has been awarded a Power of Communities Grant funded by the NHS in collaboration with Leeds Community Foundation. This grant enables HEA to build on the learning from the TS Health Grant funded work, to develop new and innovative ways of working with people of all ages. Focusing on Loneliness, Carers, Health inequalities and Helping the NHS system, during seasonal pressures. Providing a platform for people to obtain support relating to health and well being in an informal setting and better preparing the most vulnerable members of the community for the health and well being challenges they may be faced with.

The following services have been developed to support this initiative.

Wellness space - monthly events with access to specialist health professionals where you can learn how to look after yourself for a healthier you.

Carers Group -Advice, activities, friendship and more - because sometimes carers need support too. The first Monday of every month. St Matthews Community centre, 12.30-2.30pm, light lunch served.

Seasonal Campaign's - Look out for our seasonal advice and steps for looking after yourself come rain or shine.

Befriending and call service—tackling loneliness and isolation with regular calls to people in the community.

Community News

Happy new year – 2019 – lots of positive news for Holbeck. Best wishes to everyone at HEA for a happy new year. Over the last few months a number of positive developments have happened across our area.

- HEA have accessed additional lottery money to secure their services.
- Slung Low have agreed to move into the Holbeck Club bringing their wonderful activities closer to local people.
- Money has been secured for CCTV around the Holbeck Moor area.

Most importantly Safer Leeds have put in extra resources into the Managed Approach to renew the emphasis on policing, cleansing and related support services as part of a push to address issues relating to street sex work raised in the local community in Holbeck. This includes 4 extra police officers paid for by Leeds City Council and West Yorkshire Police, on top of our existing neighbourhood police team.

Their role includes:

- providing a faster response to calls made through the dedicated phone line 07534 309568
- building positive relationships with sex workers to support greater confidence in reporting concerns or where they have been a victim of crime and signposting them to specialist support services:
- acting on intelligence provided by a range of partners, including local people, to increase presence and patrols in areas flagged for concern;
- •using proactive enforcement measures to tackle a variety of issues and target those not abiding by the rules; including soliciting and kerb crawling in residential areas which is not tolerated:
- getting to know local residents, community representatives and businesses to understand their concerns and feed them back to influence operational and strategic management of the initiative.

Taken together we will see some positive steps for Holbeck in the year ahead.
