Keeping warm together

As many of you will be aware we had a very busy end to 2022. Alongside delivering all of our usual services and activities we had an invite to meet His Majesty King Charles III on his visit to Leeds (see p.2), a full month of Christmas celebrations and events (p.3), and a chance to set up our wonderful charity shop 'reloved' in the centre of Leeds as a 'pop up' shop in Victoria Gate (p.4).

It was a joy to also see our Holbeck community coming together to celebrate 30 years of Holbeck Together supporting people in the area. As I noted at that event we couldn't operate and do what we do without the support of the Holbeck community, our volunteers and our wonderful staff team. So, thank you once again to everyone for your continued support.

Amongst these moments of celebration, we know from our daily conversations with people living in Holbeck that our community still faces a lot of challenges. Across the city demand for the council's local welfare support has increased as food and energy price hikes take their toll. We know that people are making daily choices about whether they should have food or put the heating on. Food banks, fuel banks, bed banks and warm spaces



are now unfortunately becoming more and more common ways to try and alleviate the dire straits that people are experiencing.

During the pandemic we kept our doors open and supplied 13,000 meals into the community. And now we commit to using the resources we have to provide services that practically help people during this cost-of-living crisis.

Services such as our Social Supermarket or the safe, warm space of St Matthews are here for that purpose. We encourage and welcome people to use these community resources over the coming months.

We also want people to know that St Matthews is more than just a space to keep warm. It's a hub of activities and classes; it now has a designated café space for you to meet your friends over a cup of coffee; a Social Supermarket and a charity shop – so plenty to browse after your cup of coffee. (See p.10 for more info). We can guarantee that whether you are someone who regularly pops in or has never visited St Matthews you will be met by a smile and welcome.

If you are a business based in Leeds or someone inspired by our community work please do consider supporting us as an organisation – through donations, volunteering or other fundraising activities. We continue to balance the demand for services with ways in which we can subsidise access to our activities, food and transport for the people who need it the most. Funding these services so we can keep costs down, and free where we can, remains our priority for the coming year.

Together we know we can continue to make a difference to people's lives.

A MEETING WITH HIS MAJESTY KING CHARLES III

Many people will have seen the wonderful coverage of His Majesty King Charles III and Queen Consort's visit to Yorkshire which took place in November 2022.

Our Chief Officer Elissa Newman had the absolute honour of being invited to meet King Charles III at a closed round table meeting on his visit. The invite was extended to us by the Chief Executive of Leeds City Council Tom Riordan. It was hosted by one of our key supporters, Leeds Building Society and Holbeck Together was joined by five other local charities. This was an opportunity for us to share with The King, some direct insights into what the current situation is like for our community in Holbeck.

The meeting was linked with financial services representation in the city and our presence was a living example of how businesses such as Leeds Building Society commit and support local communities. Since 2017 Leeds Building Society have supported our charity by providing office space at The Old Box Office from which we can provide our services. They have also annually supported us with food collections, Christmas present drives and other fundraising initiatives. Their support of our work, services and activities needs to be applauded and we further thank them for giving us the opportunity to speak directly to The King about our work.

As Elissa reflected: "This was an important opportunity for our organisation and the community we serve as it coincided with us marking the fact that we have been based as a charity in the community for 30 years. We are acutely aware of the challenges that face many people in the UK at the moment due to the costof-living crisis.

In meeting His Majesty King Charles III, I gave an insight of what it is like for people living in areas such as Holbeck – the choices people have to make between basics such as food, clothing, heating. The health, employment and housing challenges many face on a day-to-day basis. He was very interested to hear about our Social Supermarket initiative and the way in which organisations like ours are responding to the need for warm spaces.

November 2022 marked a significant milestone for Holbeck Together – one of representation to the country's most significant leader, followed by an opportunity to come together, at St Matthews as a community and acknowledge our activity in the area over the last 30 years.

As we move forward, we'd like to re-iterate our commitment to being the community hub for all generations of Holbeck – a safe and warm space as well as a space for people to connect, grow and thrive."

 You can even book a session to speak to one of our team about getting support for fuel and food or advice around finance or housing issues.

Tips to keep out the cold.

Living in a cold home is bad for our physical and mental health. It can raise blood pressure, and lead to serious conditions such as strokes, heart attacks and pneumonia, as well as social isolation, sleep deprivation, depression and anxiety.

Those with an existing health condition are especially vulnerable, particularly those with physical conditions such as asthma, circulatory problems, diabetes and arthritis, and mental health issues. It is recommended that you heat the rooms that you are spending most of your time in to between 18 and 21°C. This should help you to avoid damp and should ensure you stay warm enough. A handy factsheet put together by the Centre for Sustainability will walk you through the best ways to save money on energy bills while staying warm.


